

We are pleased to share with you the International Corrections and Prisons Association's (ICPA) 2025 – 2026 Business Plan as we move into the second year of our current Strategic Plan. This plan builds on the momentum of the Business Model Review completed in 2023 and reflects our ongoing commitment to growing ICPA into a stronger, more connected, and more impactful global association.

Year two of our Strategic Plan focuses on expanding our reach while deepening the value we offer to members. Supporting our existing members remains at the core of our work, alongside an emphasis on growing our global membership and strengthening partnerships that promote ethical and effective correctional practice. Our goal is to ensure ICPA continues to be the central platform for connection, collaboration, and innovation in corrections.

We are excited about the year ahead, with a rich calendar of conferences and events that will bring our community together across the globe. We are excited about our upcoming 2025 Annual Conference, hosted by the General, on the theme of "Wellbeing in Corrections: Initiatives for Staff, Systems and Communities." The significant response to our call for papers for this conference clearly demonstrate show this theme resonates with the global corrections community. Our Annual Conference will be complemented by a refreshed approach to our Heads of Service Forum, creating greater opportunities for senior leaders to engage in strategic dialogue on the challenges and innovations shaping our sector.

In addition to our Annual Conference, we are excited to announce two new thematic conferences in 2025. Both events will continue to support the sharing of information and best practice on critical issues facing the corrections system, at both the regional and global level. They are:

- The first International Research in Corrections Conference, to be held in Auckland, New Zealand from 2 to 5 March 2026 will focus on the theme of What Works in Corrections: Research Driving Safe Environments, Rehabilitation, and Reintegration.
- The first Prison Design and Technology Conference, to be held in Rabat, Morocco from 21 to 24 April 2025, will focus on the theme of Resilient Futures: Rethinking Prisons through Innovation, Infrastructure, and Technology.

Our team is also busy planning for 2026 and beyond, including Annual Conferences in Northern Ireland, Africa, and Latin America. We are also looking towards the fifth Correctional Research Symposium in 2027 and other thematic conferences that will support the growth of the global corrections community across the world.

Beyond our in-person events, ICPA will also strengthen opportunities for year-round engagement through our thematic Networks and regional Chapters. These platforms play a vital role in fostering peer learning, cross-jurisdictional exchange, and collaborative problem-solving across our global community.







In the year ahead, we are also progressing several internal initiatives designed to strengthen the Association's foundations. These include a full refresh of our website and digital tools to enhance accessibility, improve member experience, and support more seamless engagement across our offerings. We will also continue investing in the development of meaningful partnerships to support knowledge exchange and shared impact.

Thank you to all our members and partners for your continued support and commitment. Your involvement enables ICPA to pursue its mission of advancing professional corrections and improving the lives of people and communities around the world.

- Appropriate Use of Imprisonment: We promote effective community-based corrections and advocate for imprisonment only as a last resort.








ASSOCIATION GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT
